PROGRAM OBJECTIVES AND MISSION:

The Army JROTC program prepares Woodrow Wilson High School students/cadets for responsible leadership roles while making them aware of their rights, responsibilities, and privileges as American citizens. The program will provide a quality citizenship, character, and leadership development program which has the mission to "To motivate young people to be better citizens."

SCOPE:

JROTC is a High School elective course for grades 9 through 12. Students are required to take this class for one full year to receive two academic credits.

The JROTC program, like other electives has specific guidelines and expectations. It is important for each cadet to adhere to the prescribed standards set forth in this elective. Cadets will normally wear the uniform once a week. Proper wear of and respect for the uniform is one of the fundamental course requirements. In order to pass this elective class, a cadet must satisfy this requirement successfully. The term 'properly' is defined as being in accordance with the Department of the Army regulations, and Manor JROTC policy. The standard for proper uniform wear and the associated/acceptable grooming is covered in detail at the start of the academic year. Additionally, once the uniform is issued, the cadet is expected to maintain it properly meaning clean and serviceable.

DESCRIPTION:

This course includes classroom instruction and laboratory instruction in the history, customs, traditions and purpose of Army JROTC. The course develops basic leadership skills to include leadership principles, values and attributes. Physical fitness, diet, nutrition, healthy lifestyles and awareness of substance abuse and prevention, basic first aid measures, and geography are incorporated. A study of the U.S. Constitution, Bill of Rights, responsibilities of U.S. citizens and the federal justice system. Negotiating, decision-making, problem solving, planning, team development, project management, mentoring, and appreciation for diversity are incorporated. The program will provide opportunities to demonstrate leadership potential in assigned command, staff or leadership position within the cadet battalion organizational structure. Instruction will include how to use emotional intelligence in leadership situations as well as developing a positive attitude, preventing violence and managing anger. The program provide instruction on proper etiquette, daily planning and financial planning. The performance standards in this course are based on the performance standards identified in the curriculum for the U.S. Army JROTC program. Successful completion of at least three units of credit in the Army JROTC program

will qualify the student for advanced placement in a college ROTC program or accelerated promotion in the military service.

OBJECTIVES/LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- Our greatest emphasis is on developing essential life skills!
- Provide greater opportunities post high school by refining Career Plans: College, Military, and Work Force.
- Lead a program that teaches all students to be better citizens!
- Develop leadership skills. Strong emphasis on developing student leaders who effectively run the program/battalion.
- Build effective relationships within the program, school, and local community.
- Relate events in U.S. history and current events to choices and responsibilities young Americans have today.
- Maximize student potential for success through learning, self-improvement and self-management.
- Incorporate principles of mental and physical wellness into behaviors and decisions.
- Correlate the rights and responsibilities of citizenship to the purposes of the U.S. constitution and government.
- Characterize the role of the military and other national service organizations in building a democracy and maintaining peace in a democratic society.
- Provide a disciplined and deliberate approach to leadership and development.
